Outstanding Community Youth Award

Nomination Criteria

The Pete Swensson Outstanding Community Youth Award is awarded annually to a Langley student in grade 11 or 12 to recognize athletic achievements, scholastic effort, community involvement, and personal qualities. This prestigious award is in memory of Pete Swensson, an internationally recognized athlete, the originator of the Langley Walk, and an outstanding member of the community.

Eligibility

The individual must:

- attend a Langley high school and be in grade 11 or 12
- maintain a high scholastic effort
- participate in any school athletic activity (individual/team) during the current school year
- make contributions to the community through volunteer work
- be recommended by school staff through school principal (one nomination per school)

Submission Requirements

- Complete the Nomination Form
- Attach reference letters: one from school staff representative and one from the community at large. Letters must include specific examples of how the nominee exemplifies the criteria (noted below)
- Attach or email a recent high quality photo of the nominee:
 - » head shot
 - » jpg format (300dpi or 2-4mb)
- Attach or email any high quality photos of the nominee completing volunteer work:
 - » jpg format (300dpi or 2-4mb)
- Photos provided may be used in newspapers, websites, and Township of Langley publications

As part of completing the Nomination Form, cite specific examples for each criteria noted below.

Athletic Achievements

- **Superior Athletic Ability:** has made significant sports achievements (identify school, district, regional, provincial, or national awards)
- **Sportsmanship:** exemplifies a contribution to the team and co-athletes and demonstrates sportsman-like conduct
- **Coachable:** follows instruction well; meets training, game schedules, and demands; and responds to challenges with extraordinary effort and persistence

Scholastic Effort

Demonstrates a high commitment to course work including academic, technical, and career preparation courses. Considerations should emphasize effort and, therefore, be sensitive to mentally challenged or non-gifted individuals.

Community Involvement

Exemplifies a commitment to the goals and aspirations of the community through community work which may include volunteer time to coach, referee, or assist others to reach their personal goals.

Personal Qualities

- **Leadership:** provides a positive model
- **Work Standard:** sets a high standard of performance for self, peers, teachers, and community
- **Initiative:** achieves goals through proactive effort and takes action towards improving the enjoyment of sports for others now and into the future

Additional Notes

- The quality of your submission greatly assists the selection committee
- Please print clearly
- The selection committee will contact:
 - » the nominee to verify the application content
 - » the nominator for further input as required
- Although only one submission is selected as the award recipient, the Township believes all nominees make an important contribution to the community and, therefore, all nominees will be awarded a recognition plaque at the awards event
- A \$750 scholarship will be presented to the award winner
- Applications cannot be accepted in consecutive years
- Nominees and award recipients are requested to attend the Township of Langley's annual Volunteer Appreciation and Awards Evening on **Thursday, April 2, 2020**, to receive their certificate or award

Nomination deadline: Monday, February 17, 2020

Please note that late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.

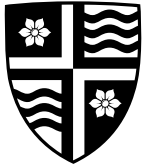
