Traffic safety, environmental protection through education and public programs, and project management for major infrastructure are also part of Engineering's responsibilities.

Township staff employed in the division note there are diverse opportunities and benefits that can be found in municipal engineering, and jobs that suit individual skill levels, interests, lifestyles, and goals.
