## Monday, November 19, 2018

The year 2018 marks the 160<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the proclamation establishing the Crown Colony of British Columbia under Governor James Douglas.

The Douglas Day Act is the smallest provincial statute, establishing November 19 as Douglas Day in British Columbia.

The celebration of Douglas Day has developed into a unique community event, presenting the Langleys with an opportunity to honour their pioneers every year for the past 72 years.

Douglas Day was established by municipal bylaw in 1946 to commemorate the founding of the Crown Colony of British Columbia on November 19, 1858, and to recognize the appointment of Sir James Douglas as the first Governor of British Columbia.
